Inner City District Carries The Message To GPCE In the weekend 15-17 November 2024, Inner City District (ICD) in Melbourne attended the General Practitioner Convention and Exhibition (GPCE) at the Melbourne Convention Centre. The event is attended by GPs, practice managers, nurses, and pharmacists. Exhibitors include pharmaceutical companies, SMART Recovery, WorkSafe and service providers. The district attended the event in 2023 and after evaluation and discussions within district groups, the district voted – almost unanimously – to attend the conference again in 2024. The conference fee totalled \$4,727 as well as costs for literature. We have most literature on hand (thanks to our literature coordinator). The AA literature available at GPCE include posters, postcards, business cards with QR codes to meeting listings as well as a range of pamphlets including AA For Busy Doctors, Alcoholism - Local AA May be able to help, If you are a professional, Is there a problem drinker in the workplace? And This is AA – An introduction to the AA Recovery program. The conference provides an app which is used to scan attendees' badges and collect contact information. Our aim, similar to last year, was to speak to as many people as possible and if they were interested, collect their contact information and email a digital PI pack (created by a local AA member) as well as other specialised information. Over the course of the weekend, we collected around 60 emails for GPs, pharmacists and nurses. We also spoke to other exhibitors, including WorkSafe and will send information about Alcoholics Anonymous and how we can help those who want to stop drinking. We are in the process of distributing information to our contact list which is expected to be completed in the next few months. We had a number of members join us to be of service at the GPCE and those in attendance had great experiences carrying the message to health professionals. However, despite an overall positive experience at the GPCE (again), it proved more difficult to find AA members to be of service this year than last year. YIS,




Area B ER Bus Advertising campaign

AA ChatNow Responders Wanted



ChatNow currently runs between the hours of 10am and 10pm AEST. We have at this stage 30 responders. If you are after a different kind of service position, want to help carry the message or are unable to attend face to face meetings to be of service this could be a great position for you.

Requirements

A desktop, iPad or Laptop and basic computer literacy. A minimum sobriety of 2 years and a thorough understanding of the 12 Steps and the 12 Traditions. Service Guidelines ask for availability of 4 hours per week per responder this is broken down to two 2 hour shifts per week. All training will be provided. "Modem to modem or face to face. A. A's speak the language of the heart in all its power and simplicity."
